GOD TIME: Your first 31 days

GT is a daily guide that will help you to establish a time with God in your life. It will acquaint or reacquaint you with the Word of God and introduce important biblical characters and themes that you will enjoy unpacking the rest of your life. Some basic guidelines include:

- 1. Select a time and place where you will daily spend fifteen to thirty minutes uninterrupted.
- 2. Secure a Bible, this devotional, and a pen to jot down ideas or things you need to talk to God about or that God has talked to you about.
- 3. Develop a process.
 - a. Start **GT** by asking God to open your eyes and heart to what He wants you to know each day. Give Him the most anxious thought in your mind, perhaps the last thing you thought about last night and the first thing you thought about this morning.
 - b. Use the table of contents in your Bible. Look up the Scripture for the day and read the text.
 - c. Read the Scripture slowly; make notes when a particular verse or word captures your attention.
 - d. Read the devotional for the day.

e. In the space provided, briefly answer the questions at the end of each day's reading.

What do I want to say to God today? What is God saying to me today?

These brief answers are for you so don't worry about how much or how little you write or about grammar or spelling concerns. Relax. These next thirty-one days are going to be exciting! Enjoy them. Your journey has begun. May God richly bless you as you begin your new life in Christ Jesus.

FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

- 1. What if I have trouble reading? You are not alone! Many people struggle early in their Christian journey with reading since it may or may not be something they have done a lot of in previous years. There are other ways of getting into the Word, such as audio Bibles. Be patient; it will come. If you need help, ask your pastor or a Christian friend.
- 2. What time of day should I do devotions? There is no wrong time to do devotions. As long as you are in the Word and looking to God, anytime is the best time. The important thing is to schedule thirty minutes into your day when you will focus on your relationship with God. Some prefer morning and others evening. Choose whatever works best for you.
- 3. What if I miss a day? Pick it up the next day and go on.
- 4. What if I encounter something I don't understand? You will; we all do. That's what is so special about a local church. When you encounter a difficult question, ask a pastor, a teacher or a Christian friend for help.
- 5. What else can I do to further my walk with God? The following are four important tools a church may provide early on to assist you in the journey:

- a. Sunday worship services are an important part of hearing the Word of God.
- b. Becoming a part of a Sunday school class that is for people who are starting out or starting over.
- c. Participation in a basic Bible study with a personal mentor has proven to be very valuable.
- d. Becoming a part of a small group is also a great way to continue to walk with God as you walk with others. Accountability and help are important as we go forward.



Read John 3:1-16.

I've only played paintball once. Our youth group was going on an outing and I was invited. We separated into two teams and the games began.

Cautious, since many of these kids had played a lot more of this game than I had, I lay down behind a log and waited on an unsuspecting adolescent "enemy" to fall into my trap. About thirty seconds into the battle, I realized there was a better place to hide just a few feet away. Carefully, I lifted my head to make sure the coast was clear when, splat, someone shot me in the face. Luckily my mask took the hit; unluckily, the game was over for me.
